PARTICIPANT'S INFORMATION PACKET

PURPOSE: To select the Goleta Teen of the Year and Finalists for the Goleta community, to promote interest in and publicity for Goleta, and to reward Goleta youths for their contributions to the Goleta community. **REQUIREMENTS:** The Goleta Teen of the Year and the Finalists must meet the following criteria:

All Participants, in order to be a Finalist

- 1. Must be a Senior at Dos Pueblos, San Marcos, Bishop Diego Garcia High School, or Laguna Blanca School (or approved home school) and live within the 93117, 93111, 93118 or 93110 zip code areas.
- 2. Must have a minimum GPA of 2.75 (**COPY** of spring report card required with application).
- 3. Must contribute to community organizations, such as school, service clubs, youth groups, church groups, or other non-profit organizations.
- 4. Must submit completed application as well as a copy of spring 2015 report card no later than final due date of **Monday**, **September 21**, **2015**.
- Must register as a User on the Goleta Teen of the Year website. Please do this **immediately**. This will ensure you receive news, announcements and other information during the time of this program. <u>www.GoletaTeen.org</u>
- 6. Must write an essay of 250 750 words on a topic to be assigned. Due date for essays is **November 16**, **2015**, **NO LATER THAN 4:00 pm**.
- 7. Must sell a minimum of 75 raffle tickets (\$2.00 each). Proceeds *directly* benefit Goleta Teen of the Year Community Service Award Program and scholarship fund. All ticket monies and unsold tickets must be returned on or before **November 16**, **2015**, **NO LATER THAN 4:00 pm**.
- Must provide a letter of reference from a non-related adult, to be hand delivered in a sealed envelope on November 16, 2015, NO LATER THAN 4:00 pm. OR, it may be emailed to <u>connieburns12@hotmail.com</u> by the referring person (only) and must be received on or before November 16, 2015, NO LATER THAN 4:00 pm

All Finalists

- 1. Must interview with a panel of judges who represent a variety of professions in the community. Judging at the interview is based on character, maturity, resourcefulness, motivation, leadership attributes, quality of community involvement, poise, personality, speaking ability, grooming, and enthusiasm and commitment to serving as Goleta Teen of the Year.
- 2. Must exhibit enthusiasm for continued community service and for serving as the Goleta Teen of the Year.
- 3. Must participate in the programs and events throughout the duration of the program, unless excused.

The **GOLETA TEEN OF THE YEAR** must attend a majority of the activities listed throughout the year, unless his/her absence is unavoidable and excused. If the winner cannot attend the majority of events, he/she will be asked to resign and the first runner-up will take over for the remainder of the year.

BENEFITS: Finalists in the GOLETA TEEN OF THE YEAR COMMUNITY SERVICE AWARD PROGRAM will receive scholarship prizes as well as community recognition and privileges. Additionally, each Finalist will choose the non-profit organization of his/her choice to receive a monetary donation in

the Finalist's name from the Rotary Club of Goleta Noontime.

Finalists also will receive assorted gifts from local businesses.

This Program is sponsored by the Rotary Club of Goleta Noontime, and much of the funding for each year's scholarships is provided from the annual Rotary Goleta Fireworks Festival at Girsh Park. Funding also depends upon donations from the community and local businesses, sales of raffle tickets, and proceeds from booths at the Goleta Lemon Festival and Rotary Fireworks Festival.



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ADDITIONAL BENEFITS: Finalists will appreciate community accolades and rewarding experiences in handling themselves in professional settings. This experience is excellent preparation for college and careers. Participation in and completion of the Program indicates leadership qualities and dedication to the community. All GOLETA TEEN OF THE YEAR participants typically improve in self-confidence, speaking ability, and interaction with business and professional people during their term.

Completion of the Goleta Teen of the Year Community Service Award Program may be a feature on your resume for college applications, including your nomination to the program.

EXPECTATIONS OF THE GOLETA TEEN OF THE YEAR AND FINALISTS AFTER SELECTION: We strongly encourage the Teen of the Year and the Finalists to participate in these Goleta events after the Program:

- Represent Goleta Teen of the Year at the annual Rotary Fireworks Festival, by participating in the State Street Parade and helping at the Rotary Fireworks Festival at Girsh Park on July 4th 2016
- Attend (as Rotary's guest) a Rotary lunch in the Spring to speak briefly about yourself/future plans
- Participate in your school's Rotary- sponsored Interact Club, which is an on-campus club at local high schools that provides services to the local community.
- Occasional other local events

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Summary of Judging Procedures

The Goleta Teen of the Year Community Service Award Program ["GTY"] requires all Participants to complete certain criteria as outlined in this Participants' Information Packet. The Program requires the Teens to show their community spirit, tenacity, breadth and strength of character, team work, writing and speaking ability, giving and caring nature, poise, and presentation of self.

Events scheduled during the program are designed to allow the GTY Committee members and other Rotarians to get to know each of the Participants beyond what appears on their application.

The GTY Committee is comprised of Rotarians and community volunteers representing a variety of local community leaders, businesses and personalities, for a broad well-rounded perspective. There is no compensation to any Committee members. The Committee has the authority and discretion in determining the criteria for the Program each year.

In late November, 2015, the Committee will meet and evaluate the Participants based on the qualities named above, plus their essays, their application content, their reference letter, quality of community service, and their overall suitability to serve as Goleta Teen of the Year. The Committee members score the applicants independently, the scores will be tallied and the Finalists named. The Committee's selection of Finalists is final. The number of Finalists may vary from year to year (generally 5-7) depending on the proximity of the scoring and the funds available for scholarship awards.

In early December, a panel of judges will conduct an oral interview of each Finalist. The judges will evaluate and assess character, maturity, resourcefulness, motivation, leadership attributes, quality of community involvement, poise, personality, speaking ability, grooming, and enthusiasm and commitment to serving as Goleta Teen of the Year. **The judges' decisions are final.** The judges will select a Runner-up and the Goleta Teen of the Year.

The Judges typically include local elected officials, local business leaders, school officials, representatives from the Goleta non-profit sector, local personalities, and at-large community members. Normally, there are 4-6 judges, and the body of judges changes each year (although some individual judges serve for multiple years.)

The announcement and presentation of scholarships and prizes will be made at the final Award Ceremony on Sunday, December 13th. All Finalists will be honored and receive scholarships and prizes from local businesses at the Award Ceremony. At this Award Night, the previous 2014 Goleta Teen of the Year, Bella Darke, will also be honored.



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Summary of Criteria for the Program

- 1. Meet the following qualifications:
 - Must be a Senior at DPHS, SMHS, BDHS or Laguna Blanca (or accredited home school)
 - Must have a minimum GPA of 2.75 (a COPY of your Spring report card required with application)
 - Must reside in the zip code areas 93117, 93118, 93111 or 93110
 - Must complete and submit the Application on or before September 21, 2015.
 - Must have contributed time and energy to community, school, youth group, church, service clubs or other non-profit organizations. (Note: The <u>quantity</u> of hours recorded for school credit, although an excellent indication of the teen's commitment to community service, are not compared with other Participants for judging purposes.)
 - · Willingness to serve enthusiastically as the Goleta Teen of the Year
- 2. During the Program must (unless excused) participate in or complete the following:
 - Attend: Community Service Projects which include: Goleta Lemon Festival; Holiday Decorating/Work Days
 at the Stow House and other events described in this packet. The purpose of these activities is for the
 Participants to further develop an awareness of available volunteer activities in the Goleta area and for GTY
 Committee members and Rotarians to get to know the Participants in a volunteer setting.
 - Sell Raffle Tickets (75 at \$2.00 each)
 - Attend the Financial Literacy Seminar
 - Attend the Interviewing Seminar
 - Provide a Letter of Recommendation
 - Provide a written essay on a topic the Committee provides

Please provide a letter of reference for yourself, written by an adult who is not related to you. Example: supervisor at a non-profit where you volunteer, church leader, business leader, teacher, counselor,

Please choose an adult who knows you well and especially knows about your service to the community. Your excellent grades, outstanding musical or sports talents, genius at mathematics and physics are all absolutely wonderful and they help make up the package which is you, but this Rotary Program is about service to others and we want your letter of reference to speak to that service as well as to your other fine qualities. Please make sure the person who is writing the letter understands this. You may want to provide a copy of this note to the person who is writing your letter of reference.

The letter should include the following:

- The writer's name and contact information
- Your name
- How he/she knows you and for how long
- Why he/she considers you worthy of being selected Goleta Teen of the Year
- Why you would be a good representative of Goleta

Please limit to one page.

The **original** reference letter may be provided to us in one of 2 ways:

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SELECTION OF FINALISTS

Monday, November 23rd

The panel of Committee Members will meet to determine who the Finalists in the Program will be. Generally we choose 5-7 Finalists. The choice is based on community contributions (quality, not quantity), enthusiasm and participation in the events during the program, the essay, the letter of reference, and the personalities of the participants. The screening is as objective and impartial as possible, and it is very difficult for us, as you can imagine!

Occasionally, a participant has a relationship with a Committee member (son, daughter, niece, godson, etc.), and so, to maintain the integrity of the Program and keep all judging completely fair, that Committee member removes him/herself from this selection portion of the Program.

All the Finalists will be interviewing with the panel of judges the evening of Sunday, December 6th, starting at 6:00 pm, at the Goleta Community Center. Each interview will last about 15-20 minutes.

It is imperative that you attend this interview with the judges. It is the *only* time all the judges will be convening for interviews.

The judging panel will represent a cross-section of the Goleta community; such as government, business, education, youth, and service (Rotary.).

All judges will receive a copy of your application and your essay. Your interview will consist of questions based on information from your application, your essay and other general questions that the judges will ask of all the candidates.

Judging at the interview is based on character, maturity, resourcefulness, motivation, leadership attributes, quality of community involvement, poise, personality, speaking ability, grooming, and your enthusiasm and commitment to serving as Goleta Teen of the Year. **The judges' decisions are final.** They shall select a Runner-up and the Goleta Teen of the Year.

Grooming is important for the interview. Please dress as you would if you were applying for a job or representing the Goleta Valley as the GOLETA TEEN OF THE YEAR. If you have any questions about appropriate attire, please contact Connie Burns.

"It was actually pretty fun! I felt okay about 2 minutes into it, and was surprised it ended so quickly. I wanted to keep answering questions!"
