The **Finalists** will be chosen by the committee in the evening.

Finalists will be notified of their status via phone call from a Committee Member.
Non-Finalists will be notified of their status via email from a Committee Member.

Judging interviews of the **FINALISTS** at the Goleta Community Center. All Finalists will have a 15-minute interview with a panel of judges from the Goleta Community.

Welcome!

Below please find information about the Goleta Teen of the Year Community Service Award Program, including what is expected of you, and what you can expect from the Program.

If you choose to participate, we expect that you will learn more about our amazing Goleta community, how outstanding Rotary International and the local Rotary Clubs are, and how YOU as an individual can make your community even better.

PURPOSE OF THE PROGRAM: To select the Goleta Teen of the Year and Finalists for the Goleta community, to promote interest in and publicity for Goleta and for Rotary International, and to reward Goleta youths with financial considerations for their contributions to the greater Goleta community.

REQUIREMENTS FOR ALL PARTICIPANTS:

Must be a Junior or Senior at Dos Pueblos, San Marcos, Bishop Diego Garcia High School, or Laguna Blanca School (or approved home school) and live within the 93110, 93111, 93117, or 93118 zip code areas.

Must have a minimum GPA of 2.75 (**COPY** of your most recent report card required with application).

Must contribute to community organizations, such as school, service clubs, youth groups, church groups, or other non-profit organizations or charity. Self directed contributions not tied to an organization are also welcome.

Must submit completed application as well as a copy of most recent report card no later than **Monday, September 17, 2018.**

Must register as a user on the Goleta Teen of the Year website. Please do this **immediately**. This will ensure you receive news, announcements and other information during the time of this program. www.GoletaTeen.org

Finalists in the GOLETA TEEN OF THE YEAR COMMUNITY SERVICE AWARD PROGRAM will receive scholarship prizes as well as community recognition and privileges. **Additionally, each Finalist will choose the non-profit organization of his/her choice to receive a monetary donation in the Finalist's name from the Rotary Club of Goleta Noontime.**

Participation in the Goleta Teen of the Year Community Service Award Program may be a feature on your resume for college applications.

EXPECTATIONS OF THE GOLETA TEEN OF THE YEAR AND FINALISTS AFTER SELECTION: We strongly encourage the Teen of the Year and the Finalists to participate in these Goleta events after the Program:

- Represent Goleta Teen of the Year at the annual Rotary Fireworks Festival, by participating in the State Street Parade and helping at the Rotary Fireworks Festival at Girsh Park on July 4th 2019.
- Attend (as Rotary's guest) a Rotary lunch in spring 2019 to speak briefly about yourself, your future plans, and your special charity.
- Participate in your school's Rotary-sponsored Interact Club, which is an on-campus club at local high schools that provides services to the local community.
- Occasional other local events

SPONSORSHIP

This Program is sponsored and organized by the Rotary Club of Goleta Noontime, and much of the funding for each year's scholarships is provided from the annual Rotary Goleta Fireworks Festival at Girsh Park. Funding also depends upon donations from the community and local businesses

SUMMARY OF JUDGING PROCEDURES

The Goleta Teen of the Year Community Service Award Program ["GTY"] requires the Teens to show their community spirit, tenacity, breadth and strength of character, team work, writing and speaking ability, giving and caring nature, poise, and presentation of self.

The GTY Committee is comprised of Rotarians and community volunteers representing a variety of local community leaders, businesses and personalities, for a broad well-rounded perspective. There is no compensation to any Committee members. The Committee has the authority and discretion in determining the criteria for the Program each year.

On September 23rd the Committee Members will choose Participants from among the Applicants.

On October 7, 2018, the Committee will choose Finalists from among the Participants, based on their application content, quality of community service, their reference letter, essay, and their overall suitability to serve as Goleta Teen of the Year. The Committee members score the applicants independently, the scores are tallied and the Finalists named. The Committee's selection of Finalists is final. The number of Finalists may vary from year to year (generally 5-7) depending on the proximity of the scores and the funds available for scholarship awards.

A separate panel of judges will then conduct an oral interview of each Finalist. The judges will evaluate and assess quality of community involvement, character, maturity, resourcefulness, motivation, leadership attributes, poise, personality, speaking ability, grooming, and enthusiasm and commitment to serving as Goleta Teen of the Year. **The judges' decisions are final.** The judges will select a Runner-up and the Goleta Teen of the Year.

The Judges typically include local elected officials, local business leaders, school officials, representatives from the Goleta non-profit sector, local personalities, and at-large community members. Normally, there are 4-6 judges, and the body of judges changes each year (although some individual judges serve for multiple years, because they enjoy it so much!)

The announcement and presentation of scholarships and prizes will be made at the final Award Ceremony on Tuesday, October 23, 2018, at a regular luncheon meeting of the Rotary Club of Goleta Noontime

All Finalists will be honored and receive scholarships and prizes from local businesses at the Award Ceremony.

- Please type your essay, 2 pages, double spaced, at a length of 250 - 750 words. Essays are judged on creativity, content, style, punctuation, spelling and grammar.
- Please do **NOT** put it in a folder or hard cover.
- **Paper clip your essay** in the upper left corner. **DO NOT STAPLE.**

LETTER OF REFERENCE

**Due application no later than 4:00 pm, Monday, September 17, 2018.
Firm deadline. No exception.**

Please provide a letter of reference for yourself, written by an adult who is not related to you. Example: supervisor at a non-profit where you volunteer, church leader, business leader, teacher, counselor. (Note: at this time of year, your teachers and counselors are usually VERY busy!)

Please choose an adult who knows you well and especially about your service to the community. Your excellent grades, outstanding musical or sports talents, genius at mathematics and physics are all absolutely wonderful and they help make up the package which is you, **but this Rotary Program is about service to others and we want your letter of reference to speak to that service as well as to your other fine qualities.** Please make sure the person who is writing the letter understands this. You may want to provide a copy of this note to the person who is writing your letter of reference.

The letter should include the following:

- The writer's name and contact information
- Your name
- How he/she knows you and for how long
- Why he/she considers your community service involvement worthy of your being selected as Goleta Teen of the Year
- Why you would be a good representative of Goleta

Please limit to one page.

The **original** reference letter may be provided to us in one of 2 ways:

1. It may be mailed Goleta Teen of the Year, P. O. Box 164, Goleta, CA 93116 and must arrive no later than 4:00 p.m. Monday, September 17, 2018.
2. The person writing the letter of reference may email the letter directly to connieburns12@hotmail.com no later than 4:00 on September 17th. **You** may not email the letter or forward the letter. **It must be emailed by the writer of the letter.**

SELECTION OF FINALISTS

Sunday, October 7th

The panel of Committee Members will meet after the Presentations Mixer to determine who the Finalists in the Program will be. Generally we choose 5-7 Finalists. The choice is based on Participants' community contributions (quality, not quantity), enthusiasm and participation in the events during the program, the essay, the letter of reference, and the personalities of the participants. The screening is as objective and impartial as possible, and it is *very difficult for us*, as you can imagine!

Occasionally, a participant has a relationship with a Committee member (son, daughter, niece, godson, etc.), and so, to maintain the integrity of the Program and keep all judging completely fair, that Committee member removes him/herself from this selection portion of the Program.

ANNOUNCEMENT OF FINALISTS

Monday, October 8th

All **FINALISTS** will be contacted **by phone** on Monday, October 8th. All **NON-finalists** will be contacted **via email** on the same day. Please check your voicemail and email on that day so you don't miss our call or message.

When **Finalists** are called, they will be asked for the following information:

1. Time slot preferred for your interview on Sunday evening, October 21st. (The caller will give you the choices of times.)
2. The name and address of the non-profit to which you would like a donation given in your name.

On the Interview night, October 21st, please bring with you the names of your family members and guests who will be attending the Award Luncheon on Tuesday, the, October 23rd, so we can provide an attendance count to the Frog Restaurant.)

FINALISTS' JUDGING INTERVIEWS

Sunday, October 21st, from 6:00 p.m. to 8:30 p.m.

Goleta Valley Community Center

All the Finalists will be interviewing with the panel of judges the evening of Sunday, October 21st, starting at 6:00 pm, at the Goleta Community Center. **You only need to be there for your interview, which will last about 15-20 minutes.** You will schedule your time with the person who calls you on Monday, October 8th.

It is imperative that you attend this interview with the judges. It is the *only* time all the judges will be convening for interviews.

The judging panel will represent a cross-section of the Goleta community; such as government, business, education, youth, and service (Rotarians).

All judges will receive a copy of your application, essay, and letter of reference. Your interview will consist of questions based on information from your application, essay, letter of reference, and other general questions that the judges will ask of all the candidates. You can expect to be asked about your community service. This will be another chance for you to expand on your contributions to the charity, and why you enjoy being involved with it.

Judging at the interview is based on character, maturity, resourcefulness, motivation, leadership attributes, quality of community involvement, poise, personality, speaking ability, grooming, and your enthusiasm and commitment to serving as Goleta Teen of the Year. **The judges' decisions are final.** They will select a Runner-up and the Goleta Teen of the Year.

Grooming is important for the interview. Please dress as you would if you were applying for a job or representing the Goleta Valley as the GOLETA TEEN OF THE YEAR. If you have any questions about appropriate attire, please contact Connie Burns.
